This is the time of year that we come together as a Jewish community for many reasons. Of course, our faith and heritage bring us together for the High Holidays in just a few weeks. Many of us have special meals, attend services, and our favorite gathering, break the fast! We spend meal times in our Sukkot and even dance with the Torahs on Simchat Torah. The Jewish people are a "WE" community!

But it's not just our family or faith that connects us together. We also have our collective culture, our involved Jewish community, our shared history, our Jewish identity, our love of food and laughter, and our desire to be with other Jews, in happiness and sadness. For the Federation, it is our desire to provide engaging programs and supportive services to our community. It is our obligation, our duty - our commandment (mitzvah) - to provide these opportunities for everyone in the Jewish community. This is where the "WE" becomes so powerful.

Your Jewish Federation plays a significant role in our community's life. It is where the generalized "we" of any group comes together under the power of the "WE" collective, the Jewish community. It is because of you, and your financial generosity, that allows the Federation to have a life-changing impact in our community. At its core, this is your Chattanooga Jewish Federation:

We meet these goals by providing a vibrant array

of programs and services. We do this through your annual financial investment of the Federation. What can your dollars do?

\$72 - Provides two roundtrip transportation rides to a community member

\$100 - Pays for 1 month of mitzvah meals for a community member

\$180 - Provides Shabbat Dinner for one NextGen (ages 21-40) gathering

\$250 - Provides scholarship for a Jewish student to attend Aleph Bet for two months

\$500 - Provides five social service encounters from social worker or nurse

\$1,000 - Underwrites our Jew Crew teen programming

Listen to the Music of Our Community

There is a song that has followed me through every season of my life.

Not because it was written for me, but because it asks the question I have spent decades trying to answer: what does it mean to belong to something larger than yourself?

This year, Chattanooga's Jewish Federation launches its annual fundraising campaign under a theme that feels almost too personal to be coincidence: "My Federation to the Tune of My Generation." Inspired by The Who's anthem of identity and belonging, the campaign asks each of us to consider not just what we give, but who we are when we give it. It asks us to listen—to the music of our community, to the voices that came before us, and to the ones we are responsible for now.

I am writing this with a heart that is both full and broken. My father, Irv Ginsburg, passed away recently. For those who knew him, this is not just a loss to our family; it is a loss to the entire Jewish community of Chattanooga and beyond. Dad was a man who sought people. He sought connection. He sought the quiet, persistent work of making the world a little more just, a little more kind, a little more whole.

Dad believed, with every fiber of his being, in tikkun olam — the repair of the world. Not as an abstract ideal, but as a daily practice. He volunteered his time without fanfare. He showed up. He remembered names. He asked how you were doing, and he meant it. Whether he was organizing a community meal, visiting someone in the hospital, or simply sitting with a friend who needed to talk, Irv understood that the most powerful form of advocacy is presence. I knew this was true about my dad, but since his passing it has become even more evident to me. I have received multiple calls, texts, and emails about things my dad did for others that I had no idea about. Tikkun olam to dad was not a grand gesture. It was a thousand small acts of connection, repeated with intention, over a lifetime.

When I think about my father now, I hear music. Not necessarily The Who, but I hear the music of our community: the laughter at a Federation event, the prayers at Shabbat, the quiet conversations in hallways that turn strangers into family.

That is what this campaign is about. "My Federation to the Tune of My Generation" is not just a clever play on a classic song. It is an invitation to consider what your generation — your life, your values, your legacy — sounds like when it is expressed through the work of the Federation. It is an invitation to ask: what song am I singing with my time, my resources, and my heart?

My father taught me that Jewish life is not something you inherit; it is something you build together, every single day. He taught me that advocacy is not a title or a position—it is a posture. It is the willingness to stand with others, to listen before speaking, and to act before asking for credit.

As co-president of the Jewish Federation in Chattanooga, I carry that lesson with me into every meeting, every decision, and every conversation about our future. This year's campaign is not just about raising funds — though the funds are vital, and the needs in our community are real. It is about raising consciousness. It is about asking each member of our community to consider what kind of legacy they want to leave, and how the Federation can help them build it.

Irv Ginsburg lived a life of connection. He believed that the strength of a community is measured not by its buildings or its budgets, but by the depth of its relationships. He believed in tikkun olam not as a distant goal, but as a present reality—something we create together, one conversation, one act of kindness, and one gift of support at a time.

This campaign is my way of honoring him. It is my way of saying: the work continues. The music plays on. And each of us has a part to sing.

I invite you to join me. Join me in remembering Irv — not with silence, but with action. Join me in supporting the Federation's annual campaign, not out of obligation, but out of conviction. Join me in believing that our generation, like every generation before it, has something beautiful and necessary to contribute to the song of Jewish life in Chattanooga.

Israel: Make No Mistake – It is About People

Let's talk about how your campaign dollars support Israel.

No, our dollars do not support the government, politics, or the military. Israel, like us, is a democracy and their government has the right to make decisions that we may or may not agree with. Our Jewish Federation supports the people of Israel.

For more than a decade the Jewish Federation of Greater Chattanooga has supported two important people-to-people Israel-based programs. The Shlichim program's mission is to build a living bridge to the people of Israel by sharing the collective Jewish heritage, promoting Israeli experiences, and speaking authentically about faith and culture. This year if you have spent any time at the Jewish Cultural Center you probably have bumped into Linor Shirinov, our current shlichah. Linor is the 11th cultural emissary to spend a year or more with us.

We stay in touch with our past shlichim, our extended family, and most of them have returned to visit at least once after their shlichut. If you want to know what and how they are doing, please ask us. Here are a few updates on our extended family: Ofer (#10) was here for a week in August. Einav (#2) is mother to two sons and is Head of Public Transportation Planning, JTMT – Jerusalem Transportation. Shiran (#5) is our matchmaker introducing Inbal (#8) to her now husband Guy, who she married in August. Raoul (#1) develops educational programs, lectures, and events for the American Jewish community, with affiliations including Check Point Software and the University of Haifa. He is the father to four children and lives in Hadera, our Israeli partnership community.

An Israeli partnership? The Federation P2G program is a consortium of ten Southeastern U.S. cities and the Hadera-Eiron Region in Israel. P2G strives to develop deep connections between people with ongoing and meaningful engagement based on shared Jewish identity. Our partnership just celebrated its 25th year. The annual Summit was held in Richmond, Virginia in August. The CEO, a Program Professional, and a Lay Leader from each city and Israel participate. This year Randi Weiss, Chair of our Israel Committee, was our lay leader. At the Summit

we discussed target-age audiences, impact of our dollars both in Israel and in each community, and set a menu of experiences available for the next year. Watch the Shofar and our community e-mails as we begin to recruit for different activities.

What can you do now to be part of the people-to-people movement? Five Israeli teens and their chaperone that are part of P2G will be in Chattanooga from Monday, Sept. 28 and leave after breakfast on Oct. 1. On the 28th. starting after school through dinner time, we invite all children and teens for a fun dinner with the Israelis. Details are being worked out now and will be sent in an e-mail, but now is the time to let us know of your interest. On Tuesday, September 29 we will have a community dinner. Linor, our current shlichah, will interview the teens. We will learn about their backgrounds, their interests, and their dreams. You will have the opportunity to ask them questions. Also, on Tuesday and some of Wednesday the teens will be tourists in Chattanooga learning about our history, and how Chattanooga embodies Judaism. Remember this is also the week of Sukkot. If you would like to host the teens for lunch, or an afternoon snack in your sukkah, just let us know. They will also have the opportunity to work with us on a volunteer project while here.

Our Federation, your campaign dollars, supports people through people-to-people engagement. Please consider this as you make your pledge.

Looking back, I realize that this year became so much more than I expected.

This visit to Israel comes at a meaningful moment. I'll have the opportunity to hug my family, see friends, hear Hebrew everywhere I go, and reconnect with the places that shaped me. I know I'll return with renewed energy, new stories, and, hopefully, a suitcase that's just a little too full.

But one thing has changed since I first arrived in Tennessee: Chattanooga no longer feels unfamiliar. It has become a place filled with people I care about

deeply. There are faces I look forward to seeing, programs I'm excited to continue, and a community that has become an important part of my life.

I'm especially excited for what lies ahead this fall. In September, we'll kick things off with Beer (He)brew, a new Hebrew class that brings language learning into a fun and relaxed social setting, along with Yoga & Brunch for our NextGen community - a chance to connect, recharge, and simply enjoy being together. Then, as we approach October 7, we'll gather for a Taste Of Memories program, honoring those we lost by sharing recipes and the stories behind them. It will be an opportunity to remember, reflect, and remind ourselves that even in times of grief, coming together as a community is one of our greatest sources of strength.

Thank you for welcoming me, for trusting me, for teaching me, and for allowing me to share this experience with you. Your kindness has made this year unforgettable, and I'm excited for everything that lies ahead.

Here's to another year of learning, celebrating, asking questions, strengthening our connection to Israel, and continuing to build this wonderful community together.

I'm looking forward to seeing all of you very soon. Welcome to Year Two.

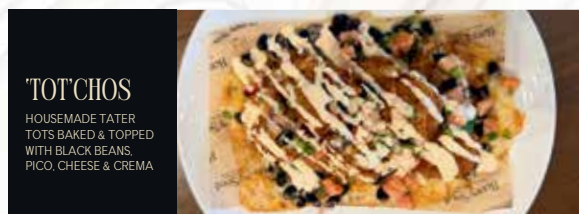

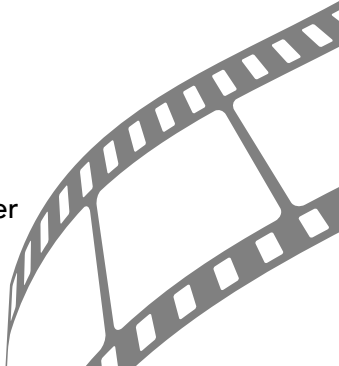
